



The State of Things to Come

A new study for the American Health Care Association by research group, Eljay, LLC, titled *A Report on Shortfalls in Medicaid Funding for Nursing Home Care* was released even before the latest proposed budget cuts. Eljay finds that Medicaid programs in states across the country underfunded nursing facility care by \$5.6 billion in 2010, paying on average \$7.17 per hour per patient, less than the nation's current minimum wage of \$7.25 per hour. A lifeline for many elderly and disabled, Medicaid funds 64 percent of the care provided in America's skilled nursing facilities nationally.

"This report reveals a truth many would not believe – today's nursing facilities are paid less than the minimum wage," stated Mark Parkinson, President and CEO of the American Health Care Association (AHCA). "That must change if we ever hope to serve the needs of a Baby Boom generation that will only stress our care delivery system further."

Now, figure into the previously stated equation about nursing facilities across the nation that Texas is ranked 49th in Medicaid reimbursement rates. Forty-eight states value the care of their elderly more than Texans. Texas nursing homes struggle to provide quality care on a shoestring budget. Add in one more factor: **House Bill 1 proposes a 33% cut to Medicaid patient care funding for Texas nursing homes.** So in addition to the already difficult financial climate, facilities are expected to absorb an enormous blow, from which many will not recover.

These cuts are on top of Federal cuts in Medicare of up to 25%.

I am asking you to help us fight HB1. It is not an exaggeration to say that the repercussions would be staggering and wide-spread if this goes into effect. Included in this edition are the names and contact information of local government representatives. If you are not from the Hereford area, please contact the appropriate representatives. A sample letter is also included in the newsletter (see page 2). I urge you to personalize it and/or send a handwritten version. Phone calls are effective (and faster too!). You might think that because you do not have a loved one receiving care, or are not a Medicaid recipient or are

paying private pay, that this does not impact you. That could not be more wrong. Private pay rates would have to go up exponentially to make up the lost revenue. If facilities begin shutting down, it affects *everyone* currently in a facility or who might in the future need long-term care or rehab. This affects you; if you are employed by a facility, do business with a facility, or live in a community with a nursing facility. This is an opportunity to make a difference! Pick up a pen or a phone and start fighting!

Sample Letter:

Dear Representative,

I am writing today to urgently request your assistance in **opposing the drastic 33% Medicaid cuts proposed in HB1**. I am a family member (resident, or supporter) for a Continuing Care Retirement Community in the rural area of Hereford Texas; King's Manor Methodist Retirement System. The facility has been an integral part of this community for almost 50 years and is one of the largest employers in Hereford. Sixty percent of the nursing facility's revenue is from Medicaid.

Texas has continuously ranked 49th in the nation in Medicaid nursing home reimbursement at levels that have not even covered the operating costs of more than half of Medicaid contracted nursing operators.

Additional 33% cuts would be *devastating* to the operations of King's Manor and other nursing homes across the state that operates on a very thin profit margin. King's Manor is currently making adjustments for the 4% cuts already in effect. Thirty-three percent cuts would result in a revenue loss of over \$800,000 in a fiscal year; there simply are not enough ways to "tighten the belt" to make up for a reduction in revenue of this magnitude.

Texans pride themselves on their strong family values and Christian compassion. However, these same Texans are about to put into effect cuts that will result in massive nursing home and rehab facility closings and reduced quality of care in those facilities who do manage to survive. Not only will there be elderly individuals with-

out a place to live or receive much needed care, but there will be job losses in communities as a result of cutbacks and facility closings. Law makers need to consider the impact this will have on the overall economy. These facilities are businesses and as such, bring revenue into a community. When one closes, that community must absorb those jobs, the facility stops buying food from local vendors, stops paying utility bills and so on. Some small communities will not survive such changes. Not only will elderly individuals be without a home, but many Texans of all ages could be displaced for economical reasons. Therefore, I am requesting that you **oppose** HB1.

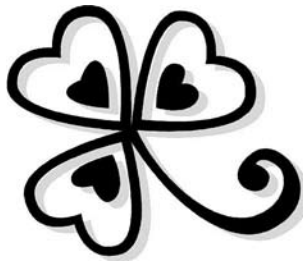

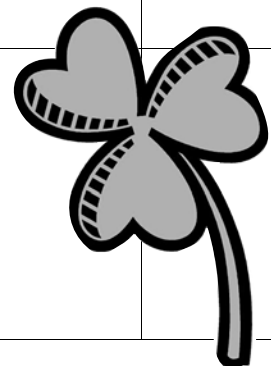
