



## *Caring for the Generations*

“Caring for the Generations” is a phrase that may sound familiar to you. It is at the bottom of King’s Manor’s stationary, on our brochures and so forth. The motto was coined to represent multiple meanings: the organization provides care for ages spanning from babies to elderly, and after nearly fifty years of service, King’s Manor has provided care for several generations. I have written those words many times before. But, I write this time with a very different perspective.

I was sitting in the Manor dining room sanding last week, listening to the late afternoon activity around me. Residents were chatting in the temporary dining room next door (the Lamar room); some were walking back to their rooms. I could hear Janie Griego, a medication aid visiting with Clora Smith in Assisted Living. I smiled as I listened to her reminisce about how, as a young woman, Janie had taken care of Clora’s mother at King’s Manor. It gave me goose bumps to hear Clora and Janie speak of a shared memory from so many years ago. I have known, of course, that many of our staff have told similar stories. But, what struck me was that it has begun happening to me as well! I suddenly began thinking of several residents who had parents here when I first started at King’s Manor 17 years ago part time as the Social Services Director.

There are so many staff members who can tell stories of having provided services of one kind or another to two or three generations.

Gwen Whittaker, Dietary Director, has worked in dietary for nearly 40 years (as of October 16, 2011). Gwen started here 40 years of years ago as dishwasher and evening cook. Gwen says “I don’t really feel that old but, then I realize that I cooked for a resident’s mother 20 years earlier! While some of us “young” employees rely on our computers to do the record keeping, Gwen has kept a record of all employees and residents that she has worked with from both Manor and Westgate. Not long ago, she and Rosie cataloged it alphabetically in a three ring binder which they recently shared with me.

As I read through Gwen’s book, names began jumping off the page at me, one after another. In flooded a sea of faces and memories; their histories and stories came back to me in waves, washing me in nostalgia. What a legacy King’s Manor has in these walls and in the hearts and memories of the employees. They were not just “residents,” they were each unique individuals with dreams and plans, accomplishments and conquests, children, grand children and great-grandchildren. I can’t express the ways in which some of these people impacted me, taught me, and inspired me. I know I have been shaped and molded through the experience of sharing just a tiny slice of their lives. If you have worked or volunteered here more than a day, then you know what I am talking about. Right here on a few acres of caleche in Hereford, Texas is an enormous treasure! I, of course, am not referring to bur-

ied treasure, but to the vast depths of human experience, wisdom and love that have passed through this place and remains here still.

I told Gwen the conversation I had heard between Janie and Clora, and her eyes lit up. Gwen said, “I remember Clora’s mother! Her name was Florence Fluitt and she loved to do ceramics. I still have some pieces I purchased from her years ago.” Clora also fondly remembers her mother’s love of ceramics and describes a beautiful ceramic Santa complete with his sleigh and Rudolph. I had not yet arrived during Florence’s time here, but I did have the pleasure of knowing her son Lyle (Clora’s brother), who lived here in Assisted Living. He was a true gentleman and a fascinating man.

Our faithful, long-time volunteer Bartley Dowell, just shared with me that he was once the Chairman of the Board of Directors and served on the Founder’s Board. His in-laws, Bob and Buella Dobbins, were some of the earliest residents of the King’s Manor cottages. They were followed by his parents Rupert and Minerva Dowell. I am looking forward to hearing some of the stories he carries under that cap of his!

Another great example, are original Founders, Bill Walden (former Founder President) and his wife Norma (former Founder’s Secretary), who continue to support King’s Manor after all these years. They came to enjoy a St. Patrick’s Day stuffed potato at King’s Manor last month.

## ***“If I Pray Louder, Will It Help?”***

If I pray louder will it help? Those are the words I thought to myself the other day driving home after taking my sister to the Cardiologist in Amarillo. For the past twenty-three years, I have been a primary caregiver for my sister who has battled with Bipolar Schizophrenia.

I have also worked in Long Term Care almost as long. I promise it is easier at times working with other people’s loved ones. Mental Health is a growing concern in this country. I don’t know that we have more of it; I just think people don’t feel as if they have to hide the condition.

We have several resources in our community for people to turn to. I do think that we need more public education geared to our young adult children on how to pick up on different signs of behavior with their peers and or loved ones.

As I reflect back to when I was young and on the different behaviors my sister had as a senior, I remember thinking that if this is what it means to be eighteen, forget it. But knowing now what I do, my sister was battling a chemical imbalance and as she reached her twenties we all just went on with our busy lives as all siblings do. Doctors say that a trauma can enhance the condition and cause it to get worse. Well, in my sister’s case it did. When she had a beautiful child, the labor in itself was traumatic. The imbalance became worse and then she moved out of state with her husband with no medical assistance for her condition for a year.

Then, she came back to Texas. I did not know who my sister was; she had always been very intelligent and independent. It took several years of tears and prayer to finally get her diagnosed.

I have many stories in between, but

there is no need in dwelling over bad things. She has learned to function with her illness to the best of her ability. I can’t dwell on (if we had just picked up on this when she was young she wouldn’t have had such a hard time.) That’s why I think it is so important to educate the community to not avoid action when noticing a change in the behavior of a loved one. Drugs and alcohol are not always the reason for a cognitive change in a person.

As I take you back to my first question, “If I pray louder will God hear me”; it’s not how loud or how often you pray, it’s do you listen and let God handle what you are asking. Now with my sister in Heart Failure, I don’t pray anymore or any less; I just pray for something different.

**This letter is dedicated to all the Caregivers; you are not alone using the resources that God puts in your path. May God bless you and watch over you, don’t pray louder just give him the worries.**



