



The Florence Nightingales of King's Manor



The second week of May (6 - 12) is National Nurses Week which overlaps with National Nursing Home and National Hospital Week, providing opportunities to honor this special group of individuals. The field of nursing owes a debt of gratitude to the English nurse, Florence Nightingale, who is considered the founder of modern nursing and made outstanding contributions to the knowledge and improvement of public health. Despite opposition from her parents, who would much have preferred that their bright and educated daughter use her energies on a well-connected marriage, trained as a nurse. She dove in head first and went to the forefront of the Crimean War of which Florence wrote was "calamity unparalleled in the history of calamity." She became famous as "The Lady with the Lamp." The wounded along the four miles of beds loved to see her because she so obviously cared

about what was happening and fought for better conditions for them. Conditions in this so-called hospital in Scutari, Turkey, were appalling. No operating tables. No medical supplies. No beds: wounded soldiers were laid on the floor wrapped in a blanket. There was no washing of linen – and every shirt was crawling with vermin. Florence ordered boilers – and boilers were installed. Florence was able to demonstrate that for every soldier killed in battle in the Crimean War, seven died of infections and preventable disease. Better food, cleanliness and good sanitation could prevent disease and death.

Ms. Nightingale's book *Notes on Nursing* popularly ranked as one of the two most important scientific books of the 19th century. One of the keys to Florence Nightingale's success in improving health conditions was that she took numerous notes on aspects of health care and organized this information in order to analyze it, draw conclusions, and make appropriate changes. She was recognized for her skill in interpreting large amounts of data and standardizing information such as the classification of disease so that different hospitals could compare their findings. As a result, Florence was the first woman to be elected a fellow of the Statistical Society and given the British Order of Merit.

For Florence Nightingale, Jesus Christ was "the most important person that ever lived." The call

to relieve suffering was such, said Florence, that we "dishonor Christ when we do not do our best to relieve suffering, even in the meanest creature. Kindness to sick man, woman and child came in with Christ."

King's Manor has its share of Florence Nightingales. While a lamp is no longer necessary - they each have their own signature. Daily acts of love and kindness occur between these walls that are never noted or sometimes even seen. But they are recorded in the hearts of the recipients. In Assisted Living, an aide stayed after her shift to do a resident's fingernails that she didn't have time to get to during her work day. A.L. aides will help out in Westgate or with Samaritan when they have someone out. Med Aides will work as C.N.A.'s to ensure a shift is covered. The aides in all departments go to the country store (where there are often wonderful finds!) and buy for residents who have a need for clothing, or require something for a special occasion. One W.G. LVN went shopping for a particular pair of shoes for a resident. They do this and other things out of their own pockets. Several of our nurses in Westgate every Friday shared a meal of canned sardines and crackers with a precious lady no longer with us. Even though that was not necessarily the nurses' favorite food, they enjoyed it because it was something the resident looked forward to.

Those kind ladies gave the resident a birthday party thinking family was going to be unable to be there. It turned out that a granddaughter arrived, making the event quite festive! Before the Christmas party, the aides did the ladies' hair and makeup so they would feel pretty for the festivities. Samaritan's nurses go over and above to provide not only pain control, but creature comforts for their patients and families. Their concern goes beyond the medical facts of the case. On any given day little acts of kindness are shown; flowers are picked, shoulders are rubbed, words of comfort are given to aching hearts and bodies.

Florence showed us that hands-on care is not the only way to show one's love and concern for patients. Good documentation and the ability to organize and analyze

data is an extremely important part of nursing. Westgate staff recently underwent a state review of resident assessment and medical records and were commended on documentation and determined to have a "zero" percent error rate. Commendations to all of our nursing staff; the Director of Nursing, Charge Nurses, Quality Monitoring and C.N.A.'s. We appreciate your hard work and conscientiousness. Proper documentation is something considered a necessary evil in our

modern health care environment and is something all of our staff has had to work hard on as regulations become more stringent.

Thank you to our modern day Florence Nightingales; who daily give a part of themselves, both heart and mind, to minister to our residents.
