



## Honoring Our Social Workers

The month of March was set aside by the National Association of Social Workers as a time to celebrate this important and growing profession. (Yes, I am aware that this is now April, but believe in the old adage, 'better late than never!') Part of the motivation in writing this article is that in general, people really have no idea what a social worker does. And yes, I will admit, I am proud to be a member of this oft misunderstood profession. Social workers we are most familiar with are often thought of as the overworked CPS worker, or the food stamp worker. And while these roles certainly may be filled by social workers, their scope of practice is infinitely broader. They can be found in private practice as therapists, in schools as counselors and mediators, in courthouses as child advocates and on and on. The Executive Director of NASW says, "Social Workers weave together the threads of society's social safety net; as the profession of hope, we help people overcome poverty, inequality, insecurity, fear, violence trauma, loss and pain..."

I love this statement. It is true for all social workers, no matter the particular field in which they work. It is certainly true for King's Manor's social worker; Becky Williams and Samaritan's Kristi Batenhorst, for both of these individuals strive to provide hope to the residents and patients in their charge. Certainly

individuals entering their "golden years" have suffered many types of pain and loss: the loss of a home, perhaps the loss of a spouse or even a child. Residents often speak of how difficult it is to say goodbye to friends they lose either by death or just physical separation. There is the fear of an unpredictable future. For the resident moving into the facility, there are many fears and concerns to be addressed. For the individual diagnosed with a terminal illness, there are certainly feelings of grief, loss and fear of the upcoming events. It is the social worker who helps them address these issues. It is the social worker who guides their family through the unknown. They have strong backbones to carry the emotions of others and broad shoulders to cry on. A box of tissue can always be found in a social worker's office.

But their expertise is not limited to empathy and guidance, but in knowledge of ways to increase independence and dignity. NASW President Jeane Anastas states, "Every day, social workers help people navigate life's toughest challenges to find hope and new options for maximum social functioning." These professionals have knowledge that can help individuals function to the highest of their abilities.

Because social workers have such diverse skills, they often find themselves given multiple respon-

sibilities. For example, in addition to being the facility's Social Services Director, Becky Williams, is also the Admissions Coordinator. She plays piano for sing along on Wednesday afternoon and when she is not interviewing residents as part of state required paperwork, she can be found in rooms visiting with residents and family members.

Kristi Batenhorst, Samaritan's social worker was the second person on the team hired. She was the volunteer coordinator, secretary, receptionist and grief counselor. As Samaritan has grown she has given up some of those hats but continues to be very involved in the volunteer program and continues in her role as the bereavement coordinator. Both social workers are involved in identifying spiritual, physical and logistical needs and working with the interdisciplinary team to ensure these needs are met. Becky and Kristi are very well versed on Advance Directives including Living Wills, Power of Attorney, and Do Not Resuscitate Orders.

While the people being visited by our social workers may just enjoy a lovely visit from that "nice lady who seemed very interested in me," in fact, the social worker is pinpointing specific needs and issues and identifying ways to address these issues. She may be identifying socio-economic needs

(social work lingo for logistical assistance with utilities, or groceries, or transportation....) or she may be determining ways in which the person can assert their independence and individuality within a group living environment. Social workers are sneaky that way, you never know when they are just being “nice” or actually working towards making your life better and more fulfilling.

This leads me to the other reason for writing this article (in case you were left wondering): We are proud of our social workers and appreciative for all that they do for our residents and families.

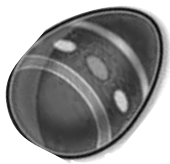
