



## *National Nurses Week*

The second week of May is **National Nurses Week** and the third week of June is **National Nursing Assistants Week**. This is a time when we reflect on the many contributions made to our society by these dedicated individuals. Long before there were antibiotics and steroids, or electronic health records, or even HIPAA; there were nurses. The earliest nurses learned their art through oral traditions passed from one generation to the next, from observations of others caring for the sick, and many times through a process of trial and error. These early caregivers were usually women because females traditionally nurtured their own families and it was thought the role of caregiver to the sick and injured would be an extension of this role. Nurses began organizing themselves into groups during the early Christian era. The nursing ideals of charity, service to others and self-sacrifice were in keeping with the teachings of the early Christian Church. Deaconesses, often Roman matrons or widows were selected by the church's bishops to visit and care for the sick in the homes. Fabiola was a deaconess who is credited with the establishment and operation of the first Christian hospital in Rome. However, throughout history, the preferred nursing care was in one's own home. Only the poor or one who had no family to care for them were sent to a hospital. Early hospitals were associated with religious communities; nuns and monks who devoted their lives to the care of the sick. Often "hospitals" in the Middle Ages consisted of pallets lining the walls of the Sanctuary. Another example was the Hotel-Dieu

in Paris in 651 A.D. According to K.J. Egenes in *History of Nursing*, the detailed records that survive from this hospital provide insights in to the state of medical and nursing care of the era. More than one patient was placed in each bed; with the feet of one patient opposite the face of another. No initial assessment or diagnosis was done thus a patient with a hip fracture might be put in the *same bed* with a patient with something highly contagious such as smallpox. Whatever your thoughts on the current status of today's health care, you must admit that we have come a long way!


In Europe, various sisterhoods were formed of groups of religious women who staffed the hospitals of the day with only very basic training. Not until Florence Nightingale entered the scene of nursing were widespread reforms made. Miss Nightingale established the Nightingale School of Nursing at St. Thomas Hospital in London. Nightingale put into the curriculum practical skills gleaned from working the hospital wards and soldier's barracks during the Crimean war, where she associated cleanliness with better outcomes.

Nursing gradually became professionalized and by 1900, hospitals had established more than 400 nursing schools. The field of nursing has grown to be so inclusive and pervasive, that it is difficult to explain the many roles they fill. Nurses can be found in public health, in private clinics, hospitals, psychiatric facilities, home health agencies, hospices and nursing homes. The job description varies wildly from one area to another.

Of course the arenas with which I am most familiar is the nursing home, assisted living and hospice. These individuals; Director of Nurses, Charge Nurses, C.N.A.'s, Med Aides, and Hospice Nurses, do more than "basic nursing" in their jobs day to day. The difference between working in these environments and being in an acute care setting is that these nurses have the opportunity to really get to know their patients/residents. The relationship is not purely clinical. Not only are they acutely aware of the physical needs of the residents, they learn their likes and dislikes, their moods, their aches and pains. The C.N.A.'s know when to offer Mr. Smith a shower and that he likes the water warmer than most. However, they also know Mrs. Brown likes her water just short of cold! In the nursing home and hospice, the nurse must become an expert reader of body language and determine from facial expressions when a nonverbal resident/patient is hurting or in discomfort. Our nurses and aides become family to their residents and the resident becomes a part of them. Not too long ago, one of our rehab residents went back home, and tears flowed from both staff and resident!

Nursing is about more than applying clinical knowledge to a living body; it is about patience and understanding, empathy and compassion, it is about the hearts and souls of human beings.

Whether you are a C.N.A., C.M.A., L.V.N. or R.N. you are appreciated for all that you do!
