## WE HONOR...

### Honored Veteran Perry Clay Ray

Today, we honor Perry Ray! A Hereford resident of fifty years who was probably known best as a local barber at Park Ave. Barber Shop, with a story to tell and an ornery streak a mile long. Perry always had a smile and would leave laughter where ever he had been. There was never a dull moment in his presence. God tells us that the joy of the Lord is our strength, so now we know why Perry was such a strong man.

Perry Ray served in the United States Coast Guard with the rank of Engineman 2nd Class ER 2-3. He was active in the military from July 2, 1957, to June 30, 1961 and continued in the reserves until he was discharged on July 1, 1963. Perry Ray was recently honored on August 11th by James Peach, the Veterans Service Officer for the Hereford area, receiving a plaque recognizing him as a Veteran.

Perry Ray was born August 19, 1937, in Manassas, Colo. His parents were Wendell Perry Ray and Minnie Bell Ross Ray. Perry went to barber school in Amarillo, Texas directly after serving his four

years in the military. He was El Paso bound when a fellow student by the name of Jim Cherry convinced him to give Hereford a try. He landed his first job as a barber at Main Street Barber Shop and worked there for many years. Then in 1972, Perry Ray and Billy Trice went into a partnership and opened Park Avenue Barber Shop where he worked as a barber telling stories and making his men laugh up until several weeks ago when his health forced him to stay home.

On June 29, 1963, he married his best friend and wife of fifty years. Iris Faye Hodges, Iris was a Frio girl and it was love at first sight. Together they made their home and raised their children in our community and we are very proud to call them friends. Their lives revolved around each other, their many grandchildren, and great grandchildren as well as their many friends. Perry would have celebrated his 75<sup>th</sup> birthday August 19<sup>th</sup>, but sadly passed away shortly before his birthday. He was a member of Wesley United Methodist Church and he cooked breakfast for the Methodist Men Breakfast for 28 years. He loved animals and his love for the outdoors took him to Conejos River in Colorado where he spent many summers fishing. Mr. Ray had also been involved in Kiwanis, JC's, and Big Brothers Big Sisters. He loved doing yard work as well. He was an avid Whiteface fan attending many of their home games and has been involved in Little League with his sons as the announcer of the games and coached as well.

So today, we the community of Hereford would like to salute Perry Ray, as well as honor him and

thank him for all he has been and done for us.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank The Hereford Brand for all their help and kindness as well as a dear friend, Mr. Mike Roberts, for so graciously helping me in getting all this off the ground. Thank you!! I could not have done it without you!!

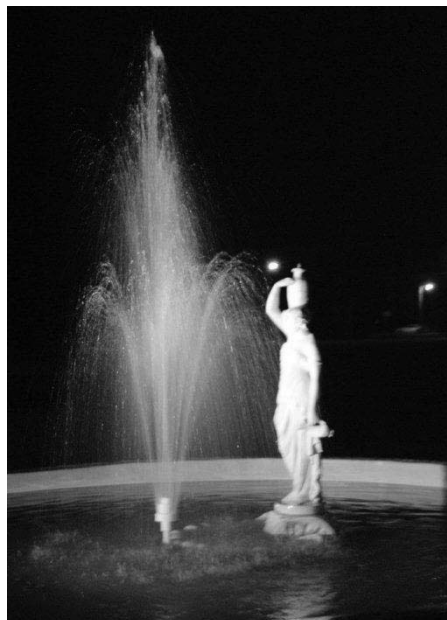
