



A Legacy

This time of year always puts me in a retrospective mood. In some ways it is my very favorite time of year: absolutely perfect weather; the Panhandle at its very finest. The colors of autumn never fail to fill me with awe at God's ever changing universe. But in that phrase "ever changing" also lies a bit of melancholy. For it is also in this season that I lost each parent, a grandmother and my mother-in-law. Interestingly, in the midst of these anniversaries is my birthday, that ever constant reminder that time marches on, even during those times when I felt that time stood still. For surely it could not go on in the face of such loss. But march on it does and eventually, I realized that I would go on as well and I began to grieve less, and to appreciate the legacy left to me, more.

All too often, we don't stop and truly assess and appreciate what has been left to us, until that person is gone. Sometimes it is years after the fact, before it becomes apparent how that person shaped our personality or influenced our life.

The national theme for Assisted Living Week this year was "Art for the Ages" and many of King's Manor residents from all different areas brought various forms of artwork to display in the Lamar Room. The display was quite remarkable and the talent pool it represented even more so. There were quilts, and oil paintings, watercolors and more, each piece giving us a glimpse into the soul of its creator. I even saw

something I might be able to create with my limited sewing abilities (and limited patience). I refer to pillows made of favorite pieces of clothing. I have some beautiful wardrobe pieces of my Mother's that I just cannot part with because I can remember how beautiful she looked in them. I could cut them up and piece them into a beautiful memory that I can enjoy and pass down. I have quilts that my grandmother made that are dear to me for that reason and further because Mother would point out different prints of fabric and say what she remembered about a piece such as:

"I remember when Daddy brought that flour sack home, Mother was so mad at him because it was so ugly!" "He just didn't get it." Of course, it was made into one of my Mother's school dresses – and both women got angry all over again, every time she wore that dress!

Quilts in particular remind me of a different age, where there was no television, and hands were kept busy all the time. The depression, the dust bowl, and then WWII meant that the things we take for granted now, were scarce. Nothing was wasted. Scraps of material left over from a dress were saved, outgrown clothes were passed down until no one smaller was left, and then what was left was put in the quilt basket. It was in this era that Faye Wright's mother learned to quilt out of pure necessity and to pass it down to her. Faye's fam-

ily brought beautiful pieces of her handiwork, quilts and crotchet, to display at her service. One quilt in particular just fascinated me; the Cathedral Windows. Each hand picked square is wrapped in a "window" of cream colored muslin. I cannot fathom the patience and stamina it took to create such a thing. It told me worlds about this sweet, soft spoken lady I knew only in her last years. I feel as though that quilt can be read like a palm, and it says that she had the patience of Job, fortitude, endurance and artistic vision. And indeed, Faye's children verify those traits in her, stating that the quilt took 3 years to complete. The legacy it left goes beyond passing down an heirloom; it speaks volumes of the traits she passed down to her children. Paula says they all tried various forms of handiwork with varying success, but what they really learned from her, is that one's hands should never be idle.

Mike Schueler kindly shared a little story with me from the Hallmark book *50 Truths Worth Knowing*, "The Most Meaningful Legacies Can't Be Measured" in which the story's author Christine A. Krahling shares stories about her grandmother, and the influence she had in her life. She tells of delicious meals prepared by loving hands, of being walked through cooking her first turkey over the phone, and of the greatest lesson ever taught her: "enjoy life to the fullest." She fin-

ishes the story with a message she read in her grandmother's assisted living facility, "I've learned... that the best classroom in the world is at the feet of an elderly person."
