



Earth, Fire and Water

Ours is a story of the elements. Usually in this part of the country, the name of the band, *Earth Wind and Fire* would be fitting. But this time it wasn't the wind that was the biggest enemy; but the extreme cold of a wintery January night in the Panhandle of Texas! The fire began in a storage room in the back of the kitchen where aprons and cleaning cloths were stored, and have been for over 25 years. The official cause is spontaneous combustion – it is not a myth – it can really happen, and did. Bad things happen in our fallen world. However, I have never been more assured that God can bring good out of bad; every time.

Picture an industrial kitchen in flames in the center of the building, smoke filling the facility from one end to the other, and bitter cold temperatures outside. Add to this equation 84 frail elderly individuals inside that compromised building. Smoke was discovered coming under the kitchen door by an employee who called Maintenance as alarms were sounding. There was an immediate response by the fire department, the Police and Sheriff's departments, EMS, Panhandle Transit, and community members. The police dispatchers had immediately begun alerting agencies to the need at King's Manor. Hereford ISD immediately set their disaster plan into effect and opened up Northwest Elementary School as safe haven to which to evacuate our residents. Custodian Paul Melendrez had the lights and the

heater on, school handicapped buses were made available and Krista Detten the school R.N. stayed until the last resident left the building. Principle David Fanning and Assistant Principle Doug Hess were there, dressed to the nines, organizing and assisting. School staff assisted in calling families and doing anything else that needed to be accomplished. Many family members took residents to the safety of their homes from the school, 43 residents were graciously taken in by Hereford Nursing and Rehab and another 17 by Castro County Nursing and Rehab. Coach Don Delozier drove one of the school buses to Dimmitt. One resident with cold feet (literally!) was generously bestowed with the socks off Coach Delozier's feet! When asked how he and Lindsey knew so quickly, Cody Chandler said they read Tonya Horrell's Facebook post that there was a fire at King's Manor and blankets were needed; and the message was quite effective!

I will never forget the look on the faces of residents as we evacuated. I cannot even imagine how frightening it all was for someone totally dependent on others to bring them to safety. I truly hate that they had to experience that feeling. I will also never forget the exceptionally kind, gentle and reassuring way that both volunteers and professional first responders handled our residents. It was a beautiful scene to witness, in the midst of a disaster. The evacuation was successful in that not one soul was injured and

not one suffered smoke inhalation.

The outpouring of community support was such that it is difficult to put in words. People with blankets, coats and helping hands poured in. Whiteface Ford and Steven's 5-Star supplied cases of bottled water. I wish I could name every one of the individuals and businesses there that night and in the aftermath; you can be assured your presence was noted and very much appreciated.

In the aftermath, meals were prepared for Independent Living Residents who normally come in to the dining room for the noon meal. Our thanks to Scott Ostercamp of Pony Express, Fellowship of Believers, Susan and Pam Perrin, First United Methodist Church of Hereford, Frio Baptist, St. Anthony's and Dimmit Church of Christ for graciously preparing and delivering meals to our residents and to First Presbyterian for wonderful desserts and Shirley Carlson for feeding our staff! Whiteface Cleaners was here as soon as we were allowed back in the building gathering divider curtains and linens to fire treat.

On Friday, January 31, the Department of Aging and Disability gave the official go ahead to bring our Westgate residents back home! Within minutes of this report, staff members were on their way to pick up our folks from HN&R and CCN&R. Hereford Regional Medical Center took in our residents that were in Westgate for Therapy so that their rehab would not be inter-

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rupted. On Saturday those residents returned. Friday and Saturday were good days: We were happy to have staff and residents back home!

Hereford Senior Citizens was so kind as to let us come in and use their kitchen to prepare meals until we could find a temporary home. Once again HISD came to our rescue and has allowed us to lease a kitchen from which to prepare meals for our residents. Our kitchen staff is preparing the meals and packing them with the same system used by Senior Citizens and then bringing them back to our facility. The Independent Living residents are being transported to Senior Citizens for the noon meal and are enjoying the camaraderie of dining with friends!

We thought we would have our Assisted Living residents back in the Monday morning after the fire. Then, we turned the boiler on, one radiator coil burst and one ceiling caved in. We called in the professionals and they fixed it. The boiler was turned back on. Plop; another ceiling caved in. And again. And again. We deemed the system in critical condition, stopped our efforts and called in the experts.

We will be bringing the building up to code with a new fire suppression system in the kitchen, lobby and common areas and Assisted Living halls and rooms. When it was built, this portion of the building was not required to be sprinkled and has been "grandfathered in" (Westgate was/is sprinkled). Further, either the boiler system will be repaired or it will be replaced with a differ-

ent system to provide heat to the building.

Assisted living *will re-open* after these updates have been completed; better and safer than ever! Unfortunately, at this time, a specific move in date is not available. It will be several weeks. There is a great deal of preliminary work to be done before you actually will see workers here. Bids have to be approved by the insurance company, plans have to be drawn up and parts have to be ordered. This is the most difficult issue of all; that our resident's and their family's lives have been disrupted. We are doing our utmost to move as quickly as possible through this process.

I have to take a moment to brag on King's Manor's staff. They exhibited extreme professionalism in the evacuation process itself and in getting residents, their charts and medication to the right places. But the

challenge was just beginning. For the next four to five days, Westgate staff was distributed to two different facility's providing care for our residents. Department heads were bouncing from one facility to another. The Assisted Living staff has been divided up, and moved, and shuffled. They have been willing to do anything and everything that was asked of them. Everyone has had tasks added to their job description that were *never* even implied upon hire and are working hard to make this transition as painless as possible for residents and family.

We are so grateful for the wonderful accepting attitude of our residents and family members.

We will persevere. We will be stronger. We will be filled with gratitude.

We will be glad when we can smell the meatloaf from our offices!
