



## The Continuing Saga of Fire and Water (Part II)

I hope beyond hope that you have not lost your faith in our honesty. Every time I give you an end date, the next you hear from me I have added a month to the sentence. It is like the promised parole date that never comes. But, I assure you it will. The only information that is passed on to you is what is told to us here at King's Manor. It just seems that there have been complications of one kind or another with each step. I have heard (and *made*) comments that we could have built from the ground up faster. That is probably true. Working in an old building with very small attic spaces presents difficulties that are not present in new builds. But, progress is being made with each day.

### Lamar Room

This room is finished! Well, it lacks a couple of small additions and then it will be stamped "finished." The carpet is installed, but when the boxes of tile for the safety flooring on the ramp were opened – there was serious nausea. The "tan" tile that was picked from the sample looked like a teenaged girl picked it out to go in her purple and pink room! Thus, it was shipped back and we are awaiting the replacement (hopefully a more mature color of taupe). When the assisted living dining room is complete, the furniture that is being stored in the back of the Lamar Room will be moved back to its proper place and the remaining new chairs will be unboxed and placed in the La-

mar Room. Though it is lacking these details, Chapel Services have resumed their rightful place in the room – much to everyone's relief.

### The Kitchen

The walls are textured and painted and at this writing, the floors are getting the final prep-work for tile. Installing tile on the floor and up to 5'6" on the walls will take about 10 days. After it has cured, Trex will set our kitchen equipment and then the plumbers will come hook everything up. Our staff will receive training on the new equipment. And the last step will be bringing in our dishes and food stuff. It is going to be beautiful and immaculately clean venue in which to prepare our resident's Thanks Giving Dinner!

### Phone System

It has been mentioned before, but the phone system wiring ran over the kitchen and has been just pieced together until it could be replaced. We are now the proud owners of an ESI Phone System. We are still working out some kinks – such as being able to recognize a call coming from an outside line from those coming from within. If we fail to answer professionally or, worse, if we hang up on you, please forgive us! We are on a learning curve.

### Assisted Living

Here is where there were some complications. Because of a change in the way the insurance company

is viewing our claim, it was determined on August 1st that there was money available to implement an ERV system: Energy Recovery Ventilation systems are now required in any new construction of hospitals and nursing homes. The unit brings fresh conditioned air into the facility and into each individual room; return air vents in the bathroom pulls out the old air. This results in the very efficient delivery of fresh air while exhausting unhealthy stale air, including odors, excess carbon dioxide, and other harmful gaseous pollutants. Though this is a very good thing, we did not know we could do it until August and then the system had to be ordered and, as with the sprinkler system, we had to wait for it to be fabricated. It is currently being installed and placement in our narrow attic is tedious work. Sheet rock, paint and carpet will follow in the next couple of weeks. Bottom line (which is what I know you are waiting on) is that the contractor hopes to have us in by Thanksgiving.

Thank you once again for the patience of residents who have been displaced and their families and for those waiting to come in for the first time. I know the news of extensive duct work and improved air quality is small consolation to those of you who are displaced.

## Samaritan Hospice Presents More Hospice Myths

**Myth: There is a strict limit on length of Hospice services.**

**FALSE:** Although the physician is asked to certify a prognosis of six months or less, there is, in fact, no limit to the length of Hospice services. Should a patient stabilize over many months, or should there be a change in the goals of the plan of care, a patient may be discharged from Hospice. A patient may choose to discontinue Hospice services at any time or for any reason.

**Myth: Hospice only serves patients with cancer.**

**FALSE:** Hospice is also appropriate for patients with end-stage respiratory, cardiac, liver, renal, and neurological diseases such as Alzheimer's, Picks Disease, Parkinson's and so on. If you feel that Hospice might be appropriate for you or your loved one, visit with your physician or call Samaritan and one of our case managers can help answer your questions.

**Myth: Hospice patients are served only in their own homes.**

**FALSE:** While many patients choose to receive services at home, Samaritan also cares for patients in long-term care nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, and other congregate living facilities.

**Myth: Hospice means giving up "hope".**

**FALSE:** "Hope" never goes away.

When the hope for cure is no longer possible, the hope for living each day to the fullest becomes the focus.

**Myth: Hospice is "depressing". I don't want to talk about death and dying.**

**FALSE:** Samaritan's staff is friendly, caring and sensitive to your needs. We emphasize life and living. Our staff does not force any kind of conversation, but can be helpful in walking both the patient and family through the process. They are available to answer questions and to provide support.

**Myth: Patients must be home-bound to qualify for Hospice.**

**FALSE:** Many patients are able to continue an active lifestyle including visiting friends and family, and pursuing meaningful interests and activities.

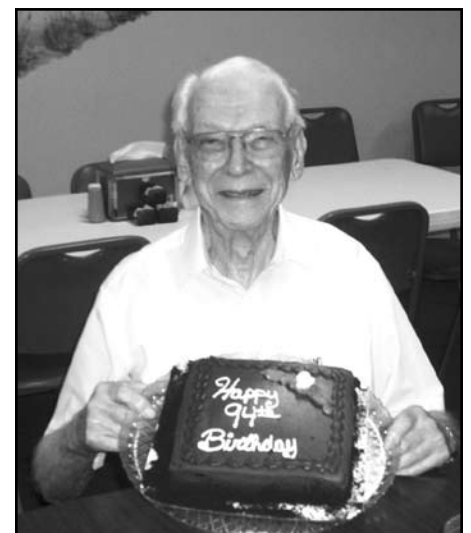
**Myth: Hospice services are expensive.**

**FALSE:** Medicare and Medicaid offer a Hospice Benefit under which Hospice services are covered 100%. Most medications, oxygen, and equipment for comfort and safety are also paid for. In addition, many commercial health plans now offer a Hospice Benefit as well. This benefit covers virtually all aspects of Hospice care with little out-of-pocket expense to the patient or family. As a result, the financial burdens usually associated with caring for a terminally

ill patient are minimal. In addition, Medicare will continue to pay for covered benefits for any other unrelated health issues outside of your Hospice plan of care.

**Myth: Patients are required to sign a Do Not Resuscitate (DNR) order.**

**FALSE:** You are not required to sign a DNR order for admission to Samaritan Hospice. We appreciate how difficult it is to make the decision about resuscitation. Samaritan's staff is available to assist the patient and family with end of life decision making and, if desired, with the preparation of advanced directives such as a Living Will, Directive to physicians or, if and when you are ready a DNR.
