



Home for the Holidays

Why is it so important for people to be home for Thanksgiving or at least Christmas? Just go to any major airport around the holidays and you will see the masses as they swim upstream like salmon to their birth place. If you watch any of the recent Hollywood depictions of family dynamics you would think no one gets along with their families. So, why work so hard to get to those very families that we complain about and fight with?

Just because we have our differences, doesn't mean there aren't strong bonds and deep love for our family members. There is something about the familiar which gives us comfort. Going back to one's childhood home or the home of a grandparent, as an adult, without fail brings back memories. When I walked into my grandmother's home of sixty or so years, I was always greeted by a unique mixture of smells that accompanied that house. And "home" is here in their room in Assisted Living. They crave to be with people who know them, who accept them and with whom they can be themselves. They miss the socialization, the camaraderie, the companionship and the activity. I don't think it's just the planned social events, but the hustle and bustle of daily life going on around them. And, staff has learned how important those residents are to us. *We* miss the camaraderie as well!

But here is the good news; we feel assured that we will be home for Christmas!! We feel sure the homecoming will be in December, though I cannot give you a specific day. They will have begun putting fresh paint on Assisted Living by the time you receive this letter. After the last nail is in the wall, and the last worker has left, we will have to have the Department of Aging and Disability survey us and give the "all clear" to move in.

On the Western Front; our dietary staff is making *plans* to cook Thanksgiving dinner in the new kitchen!! Woo hoo! The equipment is to be set by November 7, with food supplies and staff training to follow. Thanksgiving dinner may be the first meal they cook there, but the contractors are trying very hard to get us ready to go by then. But we have to plan for unexpected contingencies, like a piece of equipment not working properly or an electrical issue that needs attention. However, one way or another, we *will* be serving a Thanksgiving meal in the newly refurbished Lamar Room for our Independent Living residents and any Westgate resident's with family members coming for the day who would like to join us. We would love for any future assisted living residents to join us as well.

Samaritan Hospice Helps Patients and Families Focus on Quality of Life

Samaritan Hospice provides more than traditional healthcare. Our Hospice and palliative care programs provide pain management, symptom control, psychosocial support, and spiritual care to patients and their families when a cure is not possible. Hospice and palliative care combines the highest level of quality medical care with the emotional and spiritual support that families need most when facing the end of life.

Through this specialized quality care, we see many patients and their families experience more meaningful moments together. Hospice helps them focus on living; asking what is important to the individual. Samaritan makes your wishes a priority. A common misconception is that individuals on hospice are bedridden and at

the very end of life. This does not have to be the case. If the referral for hospice is made early enough the professionals can help manage symptoms like nausea, shortness of breath and pain, such that the individual can go see grandchildren, take a trip to a much loved place or just enjoy spending time with those they love.

Another myth is that you cannot receive medical treatment once on hospice. The truth is that just because the individual decides not to treat the admitting diagnosis aggressively (lung cancer for example) does not mean that if the person fell and broke an arm that it would not be set. The broken arm would still be treated even on hospice. If the person developed a bladder infection, antibiotics would be given assuming that is what the patient wanted.

Volunteers are a very important part of the hospice mission. “Someone asked why I spend time volunteering for hospice. Because hospice was there for my family at a difficult time in our lives, and because hospice professionals provide the highest quality of medical care when people need it most. Why do I volunteer for hospice? **It must be love!**”

During the month of November, Samaritan Hospice will be joining organizations across the nation hosting activities that will help the community understand how important hospice and palliative care can be. More information about hospice, palliative care, and
