



## February: A Time to Celebrate True Love

I recently watched the fairy tale Maleficent; an intriguing twist on the fairy tale of Sleeping Beauty or the much more eloquent title on the book on which the movie was based “La Belle au Bois Dormant.” You remember the story: “A vengeful fairy places a curse on the king’s infant daughter, Aurora, such that on her 16<sup>th</sup> birthday the princess will prick her finger on a spinning wheel and go into an eternal sleep. One of the good fairies softens the spell such that it can be broken by true love’s kiss. In this version, while the child is being raised in the forest by the ditzzy good fairies, Maleficent comes to be the child’s guardian and protector. Finding that not even she can undo her own evil curse, when the girl turns 16, Maleficent guides the handsome young prince to the palace where he might deliver the spell breaking kiss. After the delicate kiss is placed, we wait with bated breath for the captivating blue eyes to open. But nothing happens. Huh. What kind of a fairy tale is this? In fact, it is a realistic one (as realistic as it can be with fairies and curses and such). How can this boy prince who has only just laid eyes on the beautiful sleeping 16 year old, possibly truly (or even not-so truly) love her? He might certainly be attracted to her, or have passion for her, but not “true” love for her. It is only when the previously labeled “evil” fairy tenderly kisses the sleeping Aurora, that she opens her lovely princess eyes to see the person standing over her is Maleficent: the one who had loved

and protected her since she was a small child in the woods. There, I just saved you the cost of a movie ticket.

I am normally opposed to Hollywood rewriting classic books for the big screen. But, I absolved the screenplay writers because I feel it is a better portrayal of true love than story books, and Hollywood for that matter, usually manage to depict. I have nothing against romantic love, but I don’t really believe in love at first sight: At least not the kind of love that is referred to in the scriptures which according to John is a purposeful commitment to sacrificial action for another. It is not *just* a feeling or an emotion.

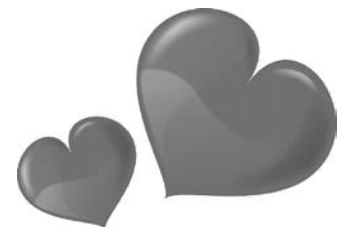
In fact, if someone really wanted to capture the essence of “true” love - they should come spend some time at King’s Manor; where love stories are unfolding all around us. Day in and day out the selfless love of children wanting to give back to their parents can be seen: daughters bringing out dirty laundry and neatly folded laundry back in, day in and day out; sons sitting in the dining room visiting; lifelong friends bringing favorite foods and tidbits of news; children and grandchildren sitting at the bedside of a dying parent or grandparent- cherishing every word and every breath - trying to prepare themselves for the inevitable moment when it is only their memories that will be left to cherish.

Corinthians 13 is so often read as part of wedding vows. Here

can be seen Corinthians 13:7 in real time, in flesh and blood, verse 7 in particular plays out before us: *Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.* These walls witness spouses bearing incredible physical and emotional burdens in the name of caring for their mate, hoping beyond hope for healing and restoration, and enduring harsh realities despite all efforts. What is so often left out of the element of love stories is this commitment to another person, sometimes when nothing is given in return. There is a sacrifice and an investment of time, energy, money and emotion. Yes, there is sadness to bear. Yes, there is pain to endure. But here, there is also such deep hope and such great love that all else pales in comparison. This is true love.

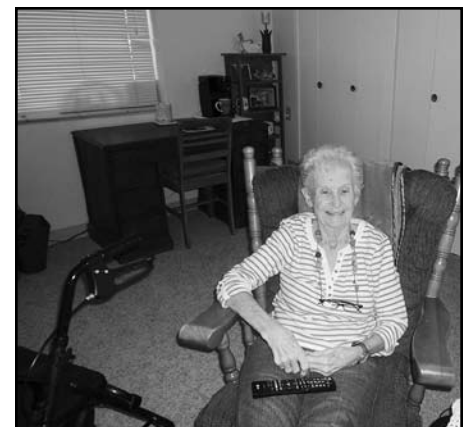
