Samaritan Hospice News

I recently read that currently in America there are over 3,000 local hospice and palliative care programs.

These programs offer specialized care to people suffering from fatal illnesses, such as cancer, Alzheimer's, heart failure, and many more.

The professional staff at Samaritan Hospice are frequently asked, what is hospice and when would the services be recommended?

The simplest explanation of the services would be: that it is end-of-life care that provides comfort and support for persons with life-limiting conditions, as well as their families. Hospice care aims to make the person comfortable and relieve their symptoms and pain for the entire length of their illness.

Samaritan Hospice utilizes a

family-centered approach that includes, at a minimum, a team of doctors, nurses, social workers, counselors, chaplains, home health aides and trained volunteers. They work together, focusing on the dying person's needs which include, physical, psychological, social and spiritual.

The goal is to help keep the person as pain-free as possible, with loved ones nearby until death. The hospice team coordinates with the person and family to develop a care plan that meets the client's complete needs for pain management and symptom control.

The services would be utilized at the recommendation of the person's physician once a terminal diagnosis has occurred.
