## Samaritan Hospice News

This article is going to explore the topic of when you become the “Parent of your Parents” and some of the issues that will have to be faced. One of the first questions that you need to ask yourself is how you can tell when your parents need assistance. This can be an issue, especially if you are like most of us that do not live in the same place where we were raised. We grew up and found ourselves out in the world and it required us to move away, whether it was fifty miles or clear across the nation. Then again, you may still live in the same town with your parents and that will help with the many issues that will occur.

I’m one of the ones that woke up as I was in the middle of my career, raising my family, working on an MBA, and yet I needed to see what was really going on with Mom and Dad. The day did come when my parents were no longer in their mid-sixty’s, they were not getting around like they once did and then their health began to change. There came a point when additional time was needed to be spent checking on my parents. This allowed me to observe their actions and patterns and see what was going on. I called once or twice a week, made weekend trips, along with staying in touch with their neighbors, friends, social groups that they had been involved with and checking with their physicians. These were all great sources to get the real picture. I did experience hearing from my Dad that, “everything is good and I’m doing great”. Then the call came from his former business associates that everybody in town watches out for the 2003 silver Buick as it moves up the street. The

day came when his eye doctor said he could no longer drive, even during day light. There I was, removing the car keys, and from his view point, his freedom. He did agree after much discussion to move into a nursing facility.

Recently, I was involved in a meeting with family members to discuss and make the decision to move my ninety-one year old father-in-law into an assisted living facility. This occurred because the RN from the home health agency had noticed his confusion was advancing and his safety was in question. I can say that I have been very blessed to have siblings that were very agreeable to all the issues that had to be worked through with our parents. It was not easy and I will not say we got it all right, but we did the best we could to be the “Parent to our Parents”.

I would like to recommend a guide to “Parenting your Parents”. It’s entitled, “When Roles Reverse” by Jim Comer who resides in Austin. He went through many things with his aging parents and wrote about the complete process and much of what can happen.

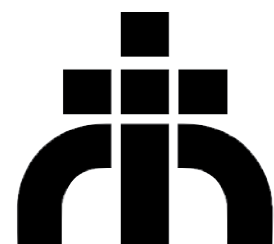
