



## Scams and Financial Exploitation

**Robert de la Cruz**, Senior Vice President of First Financial Bank in Hereford, presented a valuable program to King's Manor in February on Financial Exploitation. The bank's presentation included information that I felt deserving of a larger audience. For this article, I have included information from FFB's website, The Huffington Post and the AARP website. Every day brings more news of fraud, exploitation and identity theft and thus we must *all* be more vigilant in protecting ourselves. Though the program was targeted towards our senior population who are especially vulnerable, *none* of us are immune and the information below pertains to anyone able to answer a telephone, a front door, or a computer. Anyone can become a victim of financial exploitation.

Simply defined, financial exploitation occurs when a person or entity takes real or personal property with

the intent to wrongfully use or defraud. If you are a senior or have a senior in your family you feel may

be susceptible, then you need to be particularly vigilant in protecting yourself or the person in your care, as seniors are frequently the target of scams and exploitation. According to a True Link Financial survey, older Americans are criminally defrauded of \$12.7 billion annually. Today's fraudsters use sophisticated tools and tactics. The scams are always changing but almost always promise unrealistic returns.

### Stranger Scams

- **Lottery or Sweepstakes:** Victims are told they have won the lottery but will need to pay a fee to claim prizes or they will need your information to enter you. *Do not give them any personal information and do not pay any fees.*
- **IRS/Social Security Scam:** Victims are told they owe money to the government. They are threatened by government impersonators with criminal charges if they do not wire balance owed within a very short amount of time, usually just a couple of hours. This remains the nation's biggest scam: phone calls from fraudsters posing as IRS agents who threaten arrest, deportation, or seizure of property unless immediate payment is made for alleged back taxes. Recently, bogus mailings and faxes have been added. *But the real IRS doesn't call out of the blue or demand immediate payment, especially by prepaid*

*debit card or wire transfer. If you are ever in doubt, call the IRS directly at 800-829-1040.*

- **Home Repair:** Victims are required to pay, in advance, for unnecessary work and materials or they are charged for work that didn't take place. Often, if work is completed, victims are required to pay an unreasonable fee for services. *Get a friend or family member involved if you are having home repairs done by someone you do not know and trust. Ask them to be there if at all possible while work being done and to review the charges.*
- **Charitable Giving:** Victims are convinced to "gift" money to a non-existent charity. The federal trade commission charged four national cancer charities with defrauding consumers of millions. *Always verify that the charity is real before giving. Ask for brochures, check out its rating on [charitynavigator.org](http://charitynavigator.org), even call your local law enforcement and ask them to verify if you don't have access to a computer. Be skeptical.*
- **Telemarketing Scams:** Victims pay for a product or service that will never be delivered.
- **Utility/Alarm service person:** Posing as trusted professionals, fraudsters gain entry to victim's home. One fraudster distracts the victim while the

other steals valuables or financial documents. *Do not allow individuals into your home unless you have called their legitimate place of business and requested them to be there. If at all possible, have a friend or relative be there with you at the time they are supposed to assess your home.*

- **Grandparent Scam:** Victim receives a call that a family member has been injured and needs money for medically necessary transport. Another variant of this scam includes claims that a younger family member has been arrested and will be held until money is wired to a specified location. *If you are convinced that the request is real, first try and contact the person supposedly in trouble and/or check with other family members or friends before wiring any money.*
- **Investment Scams:** Included in these scams are advanced fee schemes, offshore investment opportunities, Ponzi/pyramid schemes, prime bank scams and commodity scams. *These scams offer large returns and fast. If it sounds too good to be true – it is!*

### For the *Almost* Computer Savvy

- **Tech Support Scam:** This is a big one. You get an unsolicited call from someone claiming to be with Microsoft or Windows tech support and says that viruses have been detected on your computer. In order to protect your data, you are told to immediately pull up a certain web-

site and follow instructions. A dummy screen may appear that shows viruses being detected; in actuality, malware is being installed that allows the scammer to steal your usernames and passwords and even hold your data for ransom. *Hang up the phone! These companies do not call you!*

- **Unsolicited emails:** Do not click on any links in unsolicited emails from “Microsoft” or in pop up ads promising to speed up your computer. If you get an email from someone you don’t know with nothing but a link, do not click on the link; this is often a virus (trust me on this one and don’t ask me how I know)! Beware if you get an email from someone you know, but the email has a subject line that looks odd or a one-liner like, “Hey, this is too good to pass up”.... or ANYTHING that looks *out of character* for the person supposedly sending it. Either call that person or email them on a new message and ask if they sent you an email with that subject line. If they cannot be reached, delete the email without opening the link. If it was real and important, your contact will get in touch with you.

- **Credit Card Scams:** Similar to the previous scam, this involves the victim receiving a *very authentic* looking email from your credit card company (JP Morgan Chase & Company has been fighting this one). I have received a couple of these and they do look le-

gitimate and I was tempted to respond. This particular scam said there had been fraudulent activity on my account and I needed to update the information in the form. Name, address, birthday, social security number, Mother’s maiden name, etc... all the information they would need to hack all my personal banking and health care accounts. There is a phone version of this scam: You get an automated call stating that suspicious charges have been detected on your credit or debit card. It’s been frozen until you call to reactivate it. Press “2” for a live attendant, who will reinstate your card after “confirming” personal information..

*Be wary. Your bank or credit card company already has all of that information; they will not ask for it online or by phone. If you call them, they may ask for the last four digits of your social to confirm you are you. But only give even this if YOU make the call. If in doubt, make a call to the number on your statement and ask if the request is legitimate.*

### Tips to Help You Avoid Financial Exploitation

- If it sounds too good to be true, it probably isn’t true.
- Keep personal information private: question anyone who wants your social security number, birthday, Medicare number or banking information.
- Shred bank statements, old

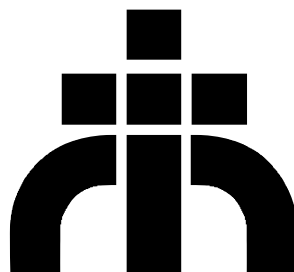

- credit & debit cards, anything with personal information.
- Check your credit report once a year.
- Lock up your checkbook.
- Establish a relationship with personnel at your bank.
- Determine now who will handle your financial affairs when you need assistance.
- Get a Power of Attorney naming a trusted friend, family member, or attorney.
- A bank’s Trust Department can be an unbiased party.
- Have a trusted individual assist you with financial decisions.
- Never pay large sums with cash. Use checks or credit cards to create a paper trail.
- Trust your gut feelings and get expert advice when in doubt.

There is not enough paper to include all of the scams that are being propagated. But perhaps this is enough to get you thinking. These scams are ever so real, and increasingly more frequent in occurrence. The elderly are most certainly a prime

target. Some of the junk mail that comes to our residents here is most alarming. Seniors are targeted not only for non-existent charities, but actual charities. Once an individual gives to one, their name is put on other lists such that the individual is bombarded with requests, each more urgent than the last.

Seniors are also inundated by advertisements for vitamins and supplements promising to cure achy joints, prostate problems, diabetic nerve pain, and so on. They are targeted for hearing gadgets that may not be at all effective. I urge you to either request that their junk mail is held, or that someone is regularly assisting the person with their mail. Buyer Beware!

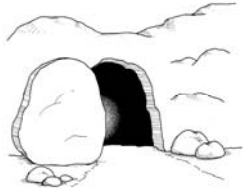
